SAY A SIMPLE YES

Just say a simple, 'Yes, I will,' (Jesus of Nazareth, Matthew 5:37, NLT)

As we approach the end of a great 2015, we are thankful for the "yes's" Porch de Salomon has received, and will receive, from our ministry partners this year. Your affirmative replies to the ministry opportunities we present allow us to, in turn, say "yes" and meet many of the needs we see in Guatemala. The indigenous people of this beautiful country continue to suffer from the world's fourth-worst chronic malnutrition rate. Women and girls suffer unspeakable harm and indignities in what is rated as the world's fifth-worst country for females. Sad stories abound

Here are a few of our recent "yes's:

- * Santa Chumil's family, only recently reunited due to relief from Porch partners, now has running water, for the first time ever, thanks to a November short-term team member's \$700 donation.
- * Lazaro's family (he and his wife have six daughters!) will soon move into their self-funded house. Lloyd writes: Lazaro has served faithfully, for years, as one of our construction supervisors. He has worked well with scores of teams and until recently, never asked for anything. He asked Noe and me, at a job site last month, for \$2000 to purchase doors and windows to complete his house. Within minutes, we said "Yes, Porch will gladly help you with this in honor of your faithful work."
- * Vilma Nimijay (31) is a single mother whose sweet family received a house, and milk/food from Porch this year. Last month, the public hospital essentially sent one of her one-year twins, Selso, home to die from pneumonia. She then visited Noe, who gave her an immediate "Yes, we'll pay for private hospitalization for this child, right now." God be praised, Selso has fully recovered (and generous folk funded this, in response to our Facebook posting).







Please provide NEW SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIPS FOR 2016

In Guatemala, over 50% of indigenous teenagers have not completed third grade. On average, indigenous Guatemalan women have only 3.5 years of school. Grinding poverty is the predominant cause of this problem; families simply cannot afford school as they struggle to put food on the table each day. For example, Brenda (below) will not be able to attend school next year without our help.

Here are three more of our current scholarship candidates (photos at right):

*Edwin (10) is an orphan who lives with his aunt. Edwin is a deaf mute and can read lips well. He completed second grade this year. He has to walk one hour, each way, to school in a different village. He will be able to attend school in his village, Chuiquel, if his aunt can pay the \$130 school construction fee.

*Fatima (15) is from Honduras. She moved to Panajachel to live with her aunt one year ago. She left Honduras to escape eight years of sexual abuse by her step-father, a gang leader there. She would like to be educated so that she can someday return and rescue her siblings. With a scholarship, she can enter the eight grade this school year.

*Marta's family had no money for her to continue her studies last year; she began working in a local diner. There, she suffered third-degree burns in a propane explosion She always wears a sweater to cover her scars and to avoid stares and worse.

Marta (18) wants a scholarship so that she can complete her final year of high school

and pursue her dream to be a teacher.

Each year since 2006, Porch de Salomon has provided school scholarships ("Becas") through the generosity of our Beca donors. In 2015, our donors funded over 100 scholarships! We are now <u>inviting and accepting donations</u> for the 2016 school year (which runs from January to October).


