Macario has been one of Porch's faithful contract house builders since he was 18 years old. He has supervised hundreds of our short-term teams' house builders in patient, skilled, and friendly fashion.

This family lives in a 4 m x 2 m room, and borrows an outhouse, kitchen, and washing "pila" area (right). Now, they will begin construction of a quality two-story house on their 6 m x 6 m property, through a \$13,000 grant from Porch. The material costs more than usual because it must be hand-carried up the village's steep paths.

Please provide NEW 2019 SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIPS

In Guatemala, over 50% of indigenous teenagers have not completed third grade. On average, indigenous Guatemalan women have only 3.5 years of school. Grinding poverty is the predominant cause of this problem; families simply cannot afford school as they struggle to put food on the table each day.

Each year since 2006, Porch de Salomon has provided school scholarships through the generosity of our *beca* donors. In 2018, our donors funded 165 scholarships!

Here are two new, 2019 beca scholarship candidates (right):

Estela (14) is one of four children; her father farms with a hoe, and her mother is an indigenous weaver. She had to quit school last year because they could not afford Estela's education any longer. Estela is a smart girl who hopes to help her village's children when she grows up.

Angel (13) hopes to enter eighth grade in January. Abandoned as an infant by his parents, he has been raised by his loving grandparents, who no longer have the money to send Angel to school.
