

We all truly appreciated the opportunity to build stronger relationships between our schools.





Porch's relief staff distributed Christmas gifts in various indigenous villages. For many of the children, this was the only gift they received. This project is the brain child of our Hilda, Jeydi, and Eugenia, themselves indigenous.

When I questioned whether we should use Porch resources for this, Hilda proceeded to "sell" it to me. She related last year's story of watching a boy's face light up, under his work load of corn stalks, when our Porch truck stopped for him. In her words: "What a blessing to see the happy faces of each of these folks, who deserve a little peace and happiness at Christmas."
