Porch de Salomon launches our next house build on July 3. Santos (42) is a humble, hard-working, indigenous single mother. Daniel's father abandoned them the day Daniel was born, 12 years ago. Santos' work, weaving and selling snacks, yields a \$60 monthly income. Daniel, one of our school scholarship recipients, helps her with this work.

They live in two crumbling-adobe, dirt-floor rooms with a leaky, perforated, metal roof. The room is cold and wet in the rainy season, and hot and dusty during the dry season. Their sanitation facilities are deplorable. Santos fears that the old adobe house may collapse on them during an earthquake or tremor.
