* Over 55 "Beca" school scholarships provided to indigenous children, youth, and adults
* Operating our Solomon's Porch Café for daily service, community events, entertainment, and a venue for the Way to be lived out in the #4 hippie travel destination *worldwide (toptenz.com)*

* Purchasing and renovating Porch's own ministry facility (comprised of the café and Hotel California) and

renovating our rental annex for office, dorm, storage, and AA meeting space

* Weekly worship gatherings at Solomon's Porch; changed lives and hope offered

* Being "salt and light" in places of despair and spiritual darkness through service, relationships, school support, and live music outreach-- in bars, local benefits and music festivals

* Alcohol/drug treatment, rehabilitation and support—including in-house treatment, teaching, food, jobs,

detoxification, and encouragement (through our partnership with *Casa Tat Loy* rehab center)

* Hosting and deploying interns and individual volunteers for mission work and global service experience.

• Continued partnership with stateside congregations to encourage *transformation* and effective local, national, cross-cultural, and global mission
