Daniel, Antonia, and their three children live in the remote *Boca Costa* region, 4.5 hours from Panajachel. Our staff met them as we delivered their beds earlier this year. They are hard-working folks, but suffer from few earning opportunities.



Francisco (two years old) suffers from cerebral palsy. Their living conditions are beyond abysmal. The dirt-floor shack home, with some walls made of plastic sheeting, leaks terribly during the rainy season.

They have neither electricity nor running water, and cook outdoors.

Our builders will construct a quality, modified-design house for them in November. The modified design will allow for faster construction than is our norm. The cost is \$8700.

Porch de Salomon completed our tenth house of 2021, and our 139th, right in Panajachel, for Mily and her children. Milly's husband died from liver cancer. His illness exhausted the family's humble finances, already in dire straits due to the pandemic.

Son Jimmy's (12) autism and other health problems

added to the family's financial strain.

At the house dedication, Noe reported:
"Thankful tears were everywhere today; Mily wished that her husband could see how beautiful the house is.

There are no words to describe Jimmy's smile and happiness, even with his broken arm."
