HOPE FOR EMANUEL: UPDATE!

As per last month's issue, Emanuel (18 months old) is our sous-chef Carmen's grandson. He is afflicted with Diamond-Blackfan anemia, a one-in-million blood disease. Emanual has undergone 14 blood transfusions.

He needs a stateside hospital to accept him and provide a bone marrow transplant. Porch's volunteer medical liaison, Jayne Mittan, P.A., is "quarterbacking" and managing leads and contacts our mission partners have provided. So far, all have been dead ends, as best we can tell. We press on.

Emanuel now has his passport, as does his 23 year-old, widowed mother Jennifer!

Please let Jayne know if you have a medical/hospital connection which might work. We would appreciate everyone's prayers. Our team aims to help this child have a full life. *Lloyd*

RE-INVENTING HOPE

Porch de Salomon has renovated/placed a ceiling in Samuel Par's confinement house near *El Tablon*. It has provided shelter to Samuel since Porch built it in 2015.

Some will remember Samuel as the indigenous father whose schizophrenia resulted in him being chained outside to a light pole, in the elements, for six years (pre 2015).

Luis Castellano, Samuel's caretaker, feeds him, gives him his antipsychotic medicine, cleans up behind him, and bathes him five times per week. Porch spends at least \$360 monthly on this.

Let us know if you'd like to help fund Porch's care of Samuel, including Luis's modest wages and transportation expenses. Our renovation cost was \$1900. We also welcome donations to cover this expense-- a literal roof covering one of God's "least of these." It's easy at:
